The Gospel of John

Background

Author: "the disciple whom Jesus loved" Jn. 21:19-24 (also 13:23; 20:2; 21:7): John the Apostle **Date**: The Rylands papyrus, discovered in Egypt in 1935, contains portions of John 18 that date to about 125 AD, meaning the book was actually written earlier. Some date it along with Revelation (same author) at about 85-95 AD. There is no mention of the destruction of the temple in 70 AD in either book, however. Also, the temple still stands in Jn. 5:2. That would date it pre-70 AD. Most if not all of the apostles have been martyred at this point, and only John remains, hence the mention of his being left behind in Jn. 21:23.

Audience: believers at the end of the Apostolic Age

Key Verse: 20:31 "But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." NIV

Purpose: to prove by his miracles (Jn. 2:22; 10:24-39; 14:8-12; 15:24-25; Acts 1:22-23), and the fulfillment of prophecy (2:17; 5:39; 6:31, 45; 12:14; 15:25), that Jesus is the Messiah. John lists a number of metaphorical descriptions of Christ:

The Nature of Miracles:

- miracles suspend the physical laws of nature
- miracles demonstrate God's control over the physical realm as well as the spiritual
- miracles cannot and should not be explained away in our testimony
- if miracles were only psychological and emotional, then they would point to us, not to God
- the purpose of miracles is to attest to the identity of Jesus as the Christ (5.36)
- miracles were to instill faith in believers (2.11; 11.15), not to convince unbelievers (12.37)
- the blessing for both recipients and observers of miracles is increased knowledge of God (10.38)

The Necessity of Miracles:

- if Christ did not do these miracles, then he cannot physically resurrect my body
- if Christ cannot physically resurrect my body, then my promised resurrection must be spiritual
- if my resurrection is only spiritual, then the physical world must be an evil thing
- if the physical world is an evil thing, then God lied when he said his creation was "good"
- if these miracles can be dismissed, then so can Christ's own resurrection
- if Christ wasn't resurrected, then he was not the Promised One (Ps. 16:10)
- if Christ was not the Promised One, then my sins remain on me (1Cor. 15:17)
- if my sins remain on me, then there is no gospel, no good news, and no eternal life
